ASSISTANT RECREATION DIRECTOR

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This is important professional and administrative work of a seasonal nature involving responsibility for planning and directing a recreation program. The work is performed under the guidance of a Recreation Director and advisory committee with wide leeway for planning a complete recreation program and assuming responsibility for final results. Supervision may be exercised over recreational staff. The incumbent does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative only)

- Assists in the promotion of the organization of recreation activities in order to secure maximum use of playgrounds and recreation areas;
- Assists in the plans for and organizes softball, basketball and other competitive sports leagues;
- Assists in training courses for recreation leaders;
- Assists in supervising the work of the recreation staff;
- Assists in the supervision of public relations activities;
- Assists in completing reports to the advisory committee on finances, recreation programs, facilities, public relations and project planning;
- Assists in conducting staff meetings for recreation leaders;
- Assists in preparing requisitions, materials, and equipment.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES & PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Thorough knowledge of the theory and practices governing and administration of a recreation program; Ability to plan, promote, and organize a wide variety of recreation activities;

Ability to plan and supervise the work of others;

Ability to get along well with others;

Sound professional judgment.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: Graduation from high school or possession of a high school equivalency diploma and either:

(a) One year of education in a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university in recreation or related field; or

(b) One (1) year of paid supervisory experience in recreational activities; or

(c) An equivalent combination of training and experience as defined by the limits of (a) and (b) above.
