FIRE CAPTAIN

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: Employees in this class are charged with the responsibility of directing the overall activities of a fire company at fires and in the station. A Captain has complete charge of operations at the scene of a fire in the absence of or pending the arrival of a superior officer. The work is performed under the general supervision of the Fire Chief and Assistant Fire Chief. The incumbent does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative only)

Supervises the work of firefighters at scenes of fire and in stations;

Assigns staff to lay out and connect hose lines and nozzles, turn water on and off, raise ladders, and ventilate buildings;

Responds to all alarms assigned to the company while on duty;

Completes pre-incident fire plans of buildings and submits to Assistant Fire Chief or Fire Chief;

Completes and maintains administrative documents and reports for designated platoons;

Inspects property at the scene of a fire to prevent re-ignition and inspects buildings and premises for fire hazards;

Inspects equipment, grounds, and the station to insure proper order and condition;

Inspects buildings and premises for fire hazards;

Maintains discipline and enforces rules and regulations at the company level;

May be required to operate and drive engine or ladder trucks when necessary;

May assist in the training and/or drills as needed by the Battalion Fire Chief;

May maintain policies, standard operating procedures and guidelines in the absence of the Assistant Fire Chief; Makes daily reports on personnel and activities and completes other documents as required.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ABILITIES & PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

Good knowledge of modern firefighting and fire prevention methods;

Good knowledge of the municipality's fire prevention laws and ordinances;

Good knowledge of the geography of the municipality;

Good knowledge of first aid methods;

Good knowledge of safety precautions involved in firefighting;

Working knowledge of department administration;

Ability to recognize fire hazards;

Ability to get along well with others;

Ability to plan and supervise the work of others and to maintain discipline;

Ability to prepare oral and written reports;

Sound judgment.

<u>MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS</u>: One (1) year of successful experience as a Fire Lieutenant or eight (8) years experience as a Firefighter.
