## JUNIOR ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEY

**DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:** The incumbent performs work under general supervision of the District Attorney and direct supervision from Assistant District Attorneys. The incumbent performs legal research, and prepares for prosecution of criminal cases in Local Criminal and Superior Courts. The work is performed under direct supervision gradually allowing some leeway for carrying out the details of assignments. Supervision is not a responsibility of this position. The incumbent does related work as required.

## **TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES:** (Illustrative only)

Receives evaluates, and pursues criminal complaints from the general public;

Performs legal research;

Uses computer applications or other automated systems such as spreadsheets, word processing, calendar, e-mail and database software in performing work assignments;

Assist in case review and issuance of plea offers;

Drafts responses to pre-trial motions and discovery demands;

Drafts appeals and post-conviction motions;

Assists in trying criminal matters in the Local Criminal and Superior Courts located throughout the county; Performs other related duties as requested from the Assistant District Attorneys.
