Section 1. There is hereby established a board of ethics consisting of five members to be appointed by the County Legislature and who shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of County Legislature. A majority of such members shall be persons other than officers or employees of the COUNTY OF CLINTON, but shall include at least one member who is an elected or appointed officer or employee of the COUNTY OF CLINTON.

2. The board of ethics shall have the powers and duties prescribed by Article Eighteen of the General Municipal Law and shall render advisory opinions to the officers and employees of COUNTY OF CLINTON with respect to Article Eighteen of the General Municipal Law and any code of ethics adopted pursuant to such article, under such rules and regulations as the board may prescribe. In addition, the Board may make recommendations with respect to the drafting and adoption of a code of ethics or amendments thereto upon request of the County Legislature.

3. This local law shall take effect upon filing as provided in Section Twenty-seven of the General Municipal Law.

LOCAL LAW #2 - 1970

BOARD OF ETHICS

OF

COUNTY OF CLINTON

A local law establishing a board of ethics.

Be it enacted by County Legislature of the COUNTY OF CLINTON as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby established a board of ethics consisting of five members to be appointed by the County Legislature and who shall serve without compensation and at the pleasure of County Legislature. A majority of such members shall be persons other than officers or employees of the COUNTY OF CLINTON, but shall include at least one member who is an elected or appointed officer or employee of the COUNTY OF CLINTON.
