BE IT ENACTED, by the Legislature of the County of Clinton as follows:

SECTION 1

By Resolution #410 of 1997, the Clinton County Legislature adopted Local Law #2 of 1997, "Reapportionment of Clinton County Legislative Districts." It has come to the attention of the Legislature that certain unintentional and inadvertent errors were made in describing Legislative Districts Number One, Number Two, Number Three, Number Four, Number Number Five, and Number Seven. Accordingly, pursuant to Section 4 (Saving Clause) of Local Law #2 of 1997 the following technical amendments are made to Local Law #2 of 1997

SECTION 2.

Section 5.A. of Local Law No.2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following:

A. Legislative District Number One (1) shall consist of the following:

The Town of Champlain in its entirety; and

That portion of the Town of Mooers lying to the east of the boundary described as follows:

Beginning at the point where the centerline of Blackman Corners Road intersects the northern municipal boundary of the Town of Mooers, thence commencing in a southerly direction along the centerline of Blackman Corners Road to its intersection with State Route 11, thence heading in a southerly direction along the centerline of the Woods Falls Road to its intersection with the centerline of Pepper Hill Road, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of Pepper Hill Road to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 11, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of State Route 11 to its intersection with the centerline of Alder Bend Road, thence heading in a southerly direction along the centerline of Alder Bend Road to its intersection with the Town of Mooers southern municipal boundary.

SECTION 3

SECTION 5.B. of Local Law No. 2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following:

B. Legislative District Number Two (2) shall consist of the following:

The Town of Clinton in its entirety; and

The Town of Ellenburg in its entirety; and

The Town of Altona in its entirety; and

The Town of Dannemora in its entirety; and

That portion of the Town of Mooers lying to the west of the boundary described as follows:

Beginning at the point where the centerline of Blackman Corners Road intersects the northern municipal boundary of the Town of Mooers, thence commencing in a southerly direction along the centerline of Blackman Corners Road to its intersection with State Route 11, thence heading in a southerly direction along the centerline of the Woods Falls Road to its intersection with the centerline of Pepper Hill Road, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of Pepper Hill Road to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 11, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of State Route 11 to its intersection with the centerline of Alder Bend Road, thence heading in a southerly direction along the centerline of Alder Bend Road to its intersection with the Town of Mooers southern municipal boundary.

SECTION 4.

Section 5.C. of Local Law No.2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following:

C. Legislative District Number Three (3) shall consist of the following:

The Town of Chazy in its entirety; and

That portion of the Town of Beekmantown lying to the west of the boundary described as follows:

Beginning at the point where the centerline of the northbound or east lane of Interstate 87 intersects the southern boundary of the Town of Chazy, thence commencing in a southerly direction along the centerline of the northbound lane on Interstate 87, thence ending at the point where the centerline of the northbound lane intersects with the southern municipal boundary of the Town of Beekmantown.

SECTION 5.

Section 5.D. of Local Law No.2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced by the following:

D. Legislative District Number Four (4) shall consist of the following:

That portion of the Town of Beekmantown lying to the east of the boundary described as follows:

Beginning at the point where the centerline of the northbound or east lane of Interstate 87 intersects the southern boundary of the Town of Chazy, thence commencing in a southerly direction along the centerline of the northbound lane on Interstate 87, thence ending at the point where the centerline of the northbound lane intersects with the southern municipal boundary of the Town of Beekmantown;

also, that portion of the Town of Plattsburgh that is encompassed by the following boundary:

Beginning at the northeasternmost corner of the northern municipal boundary of the Town of Plattsburgh where said boundary intersects with the shoreline of Lake Champlain, thence commencing in a southerly direction along said shoreline around the peninsula known as Cumberland Head to the point where said shoreline intersects the City of Plattsburgh municipal boundary, thence heading in a westerly direction and following the City of Plattsburgh municipal boundary as it angles and turns to a point where said boundary intersects the centerline of Rugar Street, thence heading in a westerly direction along the centerline of Rugar Street to its intersection with the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension, thence heading northwesterly along the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension to its intersection with the centerline with State Route 3, thence heading westerly along the centerline of State Route 3 to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22B, Thence heading in a westerly direction along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of Rand Hill Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of Rand Hill Road to its intersection with the northern municipal boundary of the Town of Plattsburgh, thence heading easterly along said municipal boundary to the point of beginning.

SECTION 6

SECTION 5.E. of Local Law No. 2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced with the following:

E. Legislative District Number Five (5) shall consist of the following:

Those portions of the Town of Plattsburgh, Town of Schuyler Falls, and Town of Peru that are encompassed by the boundary described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the centerline of State Route 22B intersects with the centerline of the Saranac River in the hamlet of Morrisonville (point located on the Route 22B bridge over Saranac River), thence commencing in an easterly direction along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 3, thence heading in an easterly direction along the centerline of State Route 3 to its intersection with the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension, thence heading southeasterly along the

Military Turnpike Extension to its intersection with the centerline of Rugar Street, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Rugar Street to its intersection with the City of Plattsburgh municipal boundary, thence heading southerly along the City of Plattsburgh municipal boundary to its intersection with the centerline of the Saranac River, thence heading westerly along the centerline of the Saranac River to its intersection with the Town of Schuyler Falls eastern municipal boundary, thence heading southerly along the Town of Schuyler Falls municipal boundary as it angles and turns to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22B, thence heading southerly along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of Brand Hollow Road, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Brand Hollow Road to its intersection with the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension. thence heading southerly along the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of State Route 22 to its intersection with the centerline of Arnold Brook, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Arnold Brook to its intersection with the centerline of the Little Ausable River, thence heading southwesterly along the centerline of the Little Ausable River to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22, thence heading northerly along the centerline of State Route 22 to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22B, thence heading westerly along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of River Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of River Road to its intersection with the centerline of Barney Downs Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of the Barney Downs Road to its intersection with the centerline of Old Town Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of the Old Town Road to its intersection with the centerline of Mannix Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of Mannix Road to its intersection with the centerline of Clark Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of Clark Road to its intersection with the centerline of Peasleeville Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of Peasleeville Road to its intersection with the centerline of Conners Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of Conners Road to its intersection with the Town of Schuyler Falls southern municipal boundary, thence heading westerly and following the Town of Schuyler Falls municipal boundary as it angles and turns northerly to its intersection with the centerline of Hardscrabble Road, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Hardscrabble Road to its intersection with the centerline of Flat Rock Road, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Flat Rock Road to its intersection with a high voltage powerline located to the east of Vassar Road, thence heading northerly along said high voltage powerline to its intersection with the centerline of Sand Road, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Sand Road to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22B, thence heading northerly along the shortest line possible to the centerline of the Saranac River, which is

also the Town of Schuyler Falls northern municipal boundary, thence heading easterly along the centerline of the Saranac River as it winds and turns to the point of beginning.

SECTION 7

SECTION 5.G. of Local Law No. 2 of 1997 shall be deleted and shall be replaced with the following:

G. Legislative District Number Seven (7) shall consist of the following:

The Town of Ausable in its entirety; and

All of the Town of Peru <u>except</u> for that section that is encompassed by the boundary that is described as follows;

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of State Route 22B and the northern municipal boundary of the Town of Peru, thence commencing southerly along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of Brand Hollow Road, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Brand Hollow Road to its intersection with the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension, thence heading southerly along the centerline of the Military Turnpike Extension to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22, thence heading in a southwesterly direction along the centerline of State Route 22 to its intersection with the centerline of Arnold Brook, thence heading easterly along the centerline of Arnold Brook to its intersection with the centerline of the Little Ausable River, thence heading southwesterly along the centerline of the Little Ausable River to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22, thence heading northerly along the centerline of State Route 22 to its intersection with the centerline of State Route 22B, thence heading westerly along the centerline of State Route 22B to its intersection with the centerline of River Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of River Road to its intersection with the centerline of Barney Downs Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of the Barney Downs Road to its intersection with the centerline of Old Town Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of the Old Town Road to its intersection with the centerline of Mannix Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of

Mannix Road to its intersection with the centerline of Clark Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of Clark Road to its intersection with the centerline of Peasleeville Road, thence heading westerly along the centerline of Peasleeville Road to its intersection with the centerline of Conners Road, thence heading northerly along the centerline of Conners Road to its intersection with the Town of Peru northern municipal boundary, thence heading easterly along the Town of Peru municipal boundary to the point of beginning.



ATTACHMENT D

EXPLANATION OF ALLOCATION OF POPULATION FOR LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

Reapportionment of Clinton County Legislative Districts is based on the 1990 U.S. Bureau of Census population figures for the municipalities of Clinton County, less the combined institutional population of Clinton, Lyon Mountain, and Altona Correctional Facilities (3,569 persons); and less the population of the former Plattsburgh Air Force Base (6,689 persons), which closed in 1995. Therefore, the population utilized for purposes of redistricting as presented in this Local Law is determined as follows:

Total 1990 Population of Clinton County:	85,969
minus population of Correctional Facilities.	-3,569

In apportioning the Clinton County population of 75,711 equally among the ten (10) legislative districts, the average population for each district (7,571) was determined by dividing the total population (75,711) by the number of legislative districts in the County (10).

In order to achieve "substantially equal weight" for all the voters of the County, each legislative district was allowed a population variation of no more than 6.5 percent of the average population for each district, as follows:

6.5 percent of the average population for each district = 7,571 X .065 = 492.115 (Since a portion of a person is not practicable, the number is rounded down to 492.)

To determine the lower limit for a 6.5% deviation from average, 492 is subtracted from the average population for each district: 7.571 - 492 = 7.079

To determine the upper limit for a 6.5% deviation from average, 492 is added to the average population for each district: 7,571 + 492 = 8,063

Therefore, each legislative district shall contain a population between 7,079 and 8,063 in order to be within 6.5% of the average population for each district.
