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1. The purpose of the law is to increase the maximum income ceiling from \$20,500 to \$26,000 for the partial real property tax exemption for property owned by disabled persons who meet certain income limitations and other requirements as set forth in Section 459-C of the Real Property Tax Law, as amended by Chapter 187 of the Laws of 2006. This amendment also results in an increase in the sliding scale portion of the exemption as outlined below:

2. The purpose of this law is to increase the income sealing from \$20,500 to \$26,000 for the partial real property tax exemption for property owned by persons 65 years of age or older who meet certain income limitations and other requirements as set forth in Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law as amended by Chapter 186 of the Laws of 2006. This amendment will allow the sliding scale portion of the exemption as outlined below:
