

On Wednesday March 17, 2010 deputies from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office arrested a local woman for the second time in less than two days for driving without a license.

27-year-old Elizabeth Decell of Altona was first arrested Tuesday March 16, 2010 shortly before 3:00a.m. on Route 22 in the Town of Plattsburgh.

Deputies stopped Decell after they observed her vehicle cross the hazard markings in the roadway several times. A DMV search showed Decell to have a suspended Vermont driver's license and a revoked New York license.

Decell was taken to the Clinton County Sheriff's Office for processing. Deputies charged her with one misdemeanor count of 3<sup>rd</sup> degree aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle and unsafe lane change. She was ticked and released.

Deputies again arrested Decell on Wednesday March 17, 2010 shortly before 8:00p.m. at a DWI checkpoint in the Town of Plattsburgh. She was not intoxicated but was still found to have a revoked New York driver's license.

Decell was taken into custody and charged with one misdemeanor count of 2<sup>nd</sup> degree aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle. She was arraigned in Plattsburgh Town Court and sent to the Clinton County Jail on \$150 cash bail of \$300 bond.

Decell will appear in Plattsburgh Town Court on April 5, 2010 to face the allegations.
