A deputy from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office who made more than 100 arrests and issued more than 600 tickets in 2009 will receive statewide recognition at an awards ceremony in Albany next month.

Deputy Anthony Cordick from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office has been selected to receive the Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) / STOP DWI Individual Law Officer Award.

The award recognizes individual Law Enforcement Officers for their outstanding achievements in deterring drunk impaired driving.

Deputy Cordick, who made 28 DWI arrests, 135 criminal arrests and issued 648 Vehicle and Traffic Law tickets in 2009 has been with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office for three years.

Deputy Cordick will join MADD, STOP-DWI, the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee, the Department of Criminal Justice Services, New York State Police and other prominent associations at an awards ceremony in Albany on November 16, 2010.

The awards ceremony will recognize individuals and agency's successes in deterring drunk driving and underage drinking.

Deputy Cordick who has made a significant impact on the Clinton County Sheriff's Office DWI arrest statistics, has been a trained police officer since 2005.
