

PRESS RELEASE FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

On Saturday March 13, 2010 the Clinton County Sheriff's Office charged a Chatham New York man with criminal impersonation.

Deputies while on routine patrol - stopped a purple Saturn on Route 9 in the Town of Plattsburgh shortly before 5:00p.m.

A DMV search of the license plate revealed the registered owner was wanted in Cohoes, New York.

The driver was questioned by deputies and reportedly told them his name was Thomas Buckton and that he was not the registered owner of the vehicle. Buckton also reportedly told deputies he did not have any identification on him.

Deputies later found a picture ID that confirmed the driver's identity as David Buckton of East Chatham, New York.

Buckton is reportedly wanted by authorities in Cohoes New York for various traffic violations.

Buckton was taken into custody by Sheriff's deputies and charged with one count of misdemeanor criminal impersonation and one count of misdemeanor aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle. He was also charged with failing to notify the DMV of his address change within 10 days of the change.

Buckton was arraigned in Beekmantown Town Court and sent to the Clinton County Jail on \$500 cash bail. He will reappear in Plattsburgh Town Court on March 15, 2010 to face the allegations.
