A Plattsburgh woman accused of burglarizing a Beekmantown home and then allegedly impersonating another individual to make threats of physical violence against a person is facing multiple felony and misdemeanor charges.

Following an investigation into a reported burglary, Deputies from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office arrested 18-year-old Megan Leary just before 9:00p.m. on Tuesday September 7, 2010.

Leary is accused of stealing property from a Beekmantown home. During the burglary Leary allegedly made threats of physical violence against a person while pretending to be someone else. Deputies charged Leary with 3rd degree burglary a class "D" felony and 4th degree grand larceny a class "E" felony. Leary also faces five misdemeanor charges for: criminal trespass, menacing, criminal possession of stolen property, criminal impersonation and aggravated harassment.

Leary was arraigned in Beekmantown court and sent to the Clinton County Jail on \$10,000 cash bail or \$20,000 bond. She will reappear in Beekmantown Court at a later date to face the charges.
