A Plattsburgh teen charged with multiple felonies in September for burglary and impersonation is now facing new felony charges related to violating the terms of a protective order.

18-year-old Megan Leary of Plattsburgh was first arrested on September 7, 2010 after she reportedly burglarized a Beekmantown home and allegedly made threats of physical violence against a person while pretending to be someone else.

Following Leary's September arrest an order of protection was issued that barred Leary from having any contact with the party she allegedly threatened.

Leary is now accused of violating that protective order by attempting to contact the protected party several times following her September arrest.

Deputies arrested Leary again on Tuesday October 19, 2010 at her residence around 8:00p.m. She was taken to the Clinton County Sheriff's Office for processing.

Deputies charged Leary with one felony count of criminal contempt for violating an order of protection.

Leary was additionally charged with one felony count of criminal mischief relating to a separate incident on August 31, 2010 where Leary is accused of throwing a baseball through a window at the Beekmantown home she was accused of burglarizing in September.

Leary was released on her own recognizance and is scheduled to appear in Beekmantown Court on November 3, 2010 to face the charges.
