Several deputies from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office recently received recognition for their dedicated service to the community.

During a ceremony at the Clinton County International Airport on December 14, 2010, Clinton County Sheriff David Favro gave three commendations which included: two medals of honor and one medal of valor.

Sergeant William Dominy who has been with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office since 2006 received a medal of honor. Sgt. Dominy was recognized for his unselfish devotion and professional conduct. Sgt. Dominy received commendation for responding to a scene in which a person was threatening suicide. Sgt. Dominy was able to defuse the situation without any loss of life or risk of public safety.

Sergeant Nicholas Leon who has been with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office since 2008 received a medal of honor. Sgt. Leon was recognized for his assistance in a dramatic river rescue. Sgt. Leon received commendation for unselfishly risking his own life to save the life of a person who had become trapped in an over-turned vehicle.

Deputy Anthony Cordick who has been with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office since 2008 received a medal of valor. Deputy Cordick was recognized for using his skills and training with an automatic external defibrillator. Deputy Cordick received commendation for his immediate response to a scene in which an individual had suddenly become unconscious. Deputy Cordick used the automatic external

defibrillator his patrol car was equipped with to shock a person's heart back to life. That person later made a full recovery.

Deputy Aaron Heroux who has been with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office since 2000 received the deputy of the year award. The Police Benevolent Association, the union that represents the sheriff's deputies, presented the award. The union recognized deputy Heroux for his 10-years of unselfish, devoted service to the department and community.
