The Clinton County Legislature recently recognized the heroic efforts of two deputies from the Clinton County Sheriffs Office and a volunteer firefighter from Champlain.

Legislators recognized Deputy Nicholas Leon and Champlain volunteer firefighter Todd Jarvis who, on April 8, 2010, responded to a 911 call about a Champlain New York man who lost control of his vehicle and ended up in the Chazy River.

When Deputy Leon arrived on scene he found a man trapped inside his car that was partially submerged in the river. Leon and Jarvis helped to hold the man's head above water until additional help could arrive to assist in the extrication. The man was transported to CVPH medical center where he made a full recovery.

Legislators also recognized Deputy Anthony Cordick who on April 23, 2010 responded to a 911 call about a man who was unconscious and not breathing. When Deputy Cordick arrived on scene he used the automatic external defibrillator (AED) his vehicle was equipped with to shock the man's heart back to life. The man was transported by EMS to CVPH Medical Center where he made a full recovery.

Deputy Leon, Deputy Cordick and volunteer firefighter Todd Jarvis all received plaques from the Clinton County Legislature. Legislators praised their training and resourcefulness in meeting the challenges they encountered during the service calls that led them to become lifesavers.
